Criminal Caseload

The charts below compare criminal case filings for the past five fiscal years.

A summary of traffic offenses and fines is presented in Table 17 on page 46. The number of Class 2 misdemeanor filings remained steady in FY2001. Both Class I misdemeanor and felony filings have shown a slight decline in FY2001.

Felony Cases

Felony filings have shown a slight decline this past fiscal year (Chart 12) along with the number of Felony jury trials and preliminary hearings while the number of Felony guilty pleas have increased. Class I misdemeanor trials have shown a significant growth of the past five years (Chart 13).

Chart 12. Felony Caseload Comparisons

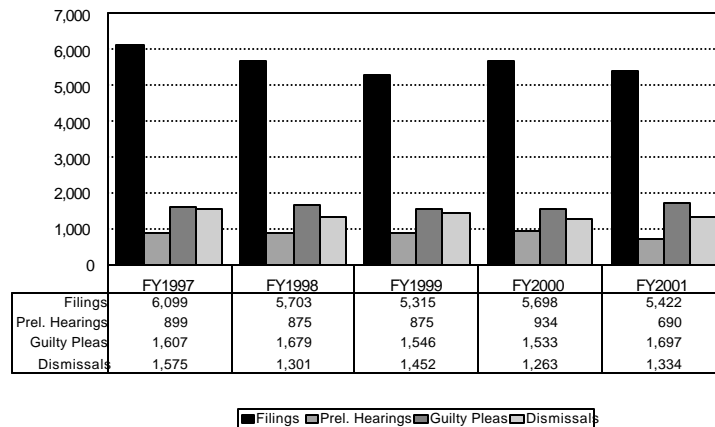


Chart 13. Five-Year Jury Trial Comparison

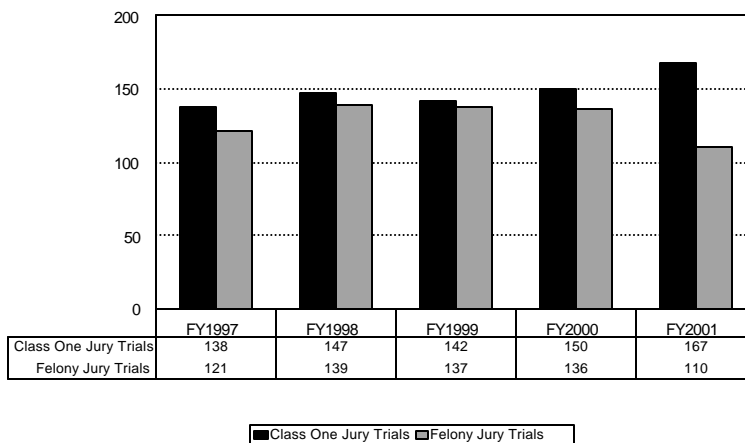
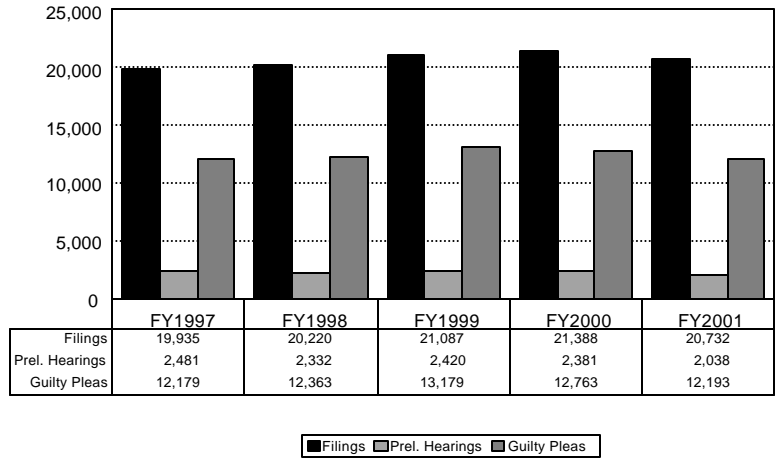


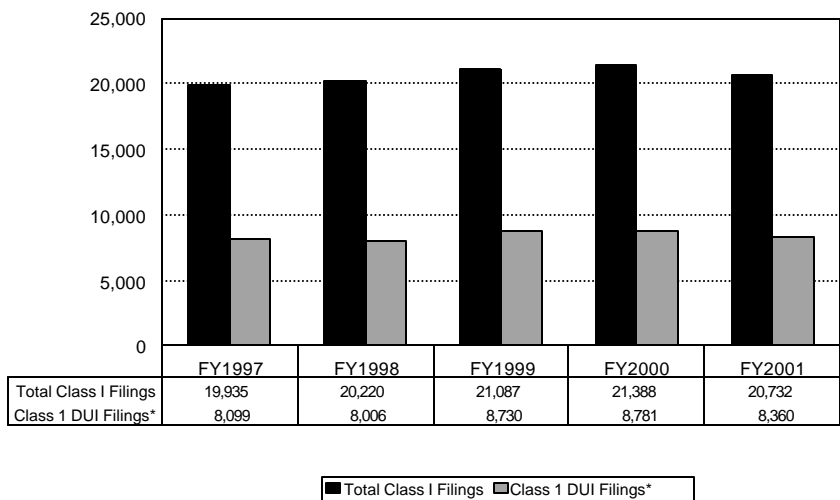
Chart 14. Class I Misdemeanor Caseload Comparison



This year's Class 1 misdemeanor filings have shown a slight decline for the first time in the past nine years (Chart 14). Chart 15 compares Total Class 1 misdemeanor filings with Class 1 misdemeanor DUI filings (first and second offenses.)

In 1987 DUI offenses accounted for 67% of Class 1 misdemeanor filings. This year class 1 DUI violations represent 40.3% of the total which has remained relatively consistent over the past three fiscal years.

* Class 1 DUI Filings only include DUI first and second offense filings. Third and fourth offenses are charged as felonies. In FY2001 there were an additional felony DUI filings for a total of 8,956 DUI filings.

DUI Cases

A significant percentage of Class 1 misdemeanors as well as felony cases are violations of ch. 32-33 and are referred to as DUI (driving under the influence) cases. The most common dispositions of DUIs for the past five

fiscal years are illustrated in Table 15. First and second DUI violations (DUI One and DUI Two) are Class 1 misdemeanors. Third and subsequent offenses (DUI Three and DUI Four) are felonies. Selected segments of this data are compared in Charts 16 and 17 on the following page.

Many of the DUI dismissals shown in Table 15 (page 42) result from a defendant's guilty plea to a lesser charge, usually reckless driving, which is also a Class 1 misdemeanor. Such plea bargains occur when a prosecutor believes the state's evidence is inadequate for a DUI conviction and the prosecutor is willing to save the state the expense of a more time-consuming prosecution in

return for the defendant's guilty plea to a lesser charge. Conviction for more than one reckless driving violation within a one-year period will result in suspension of the violator's driving license for a minimum of 30 days.

Table 16 (page 44) presents DUI filings and dispositions for the current fiscal year by county and circuit.

Chart 16. DUI Filings

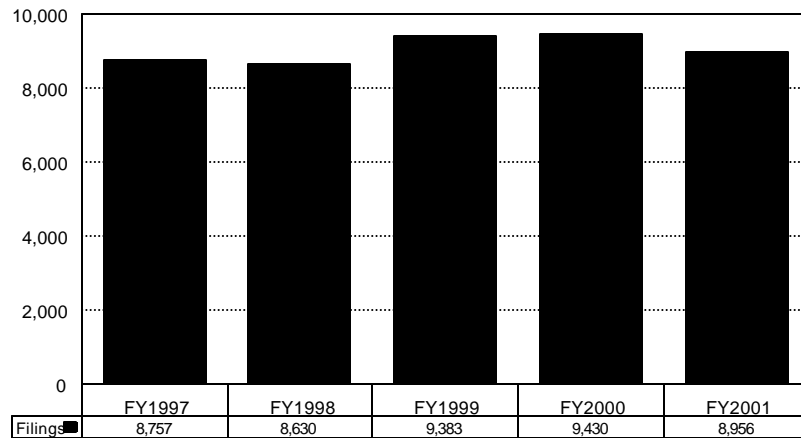


Chart 17. DUI Dispositions

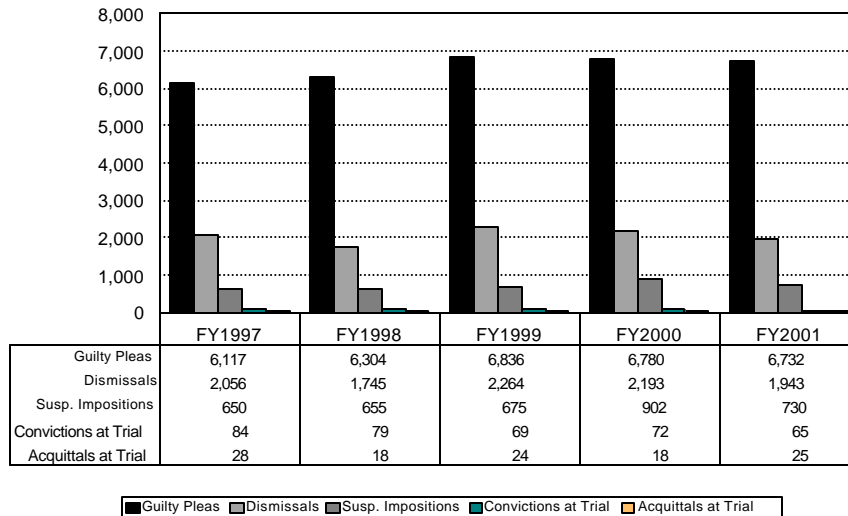

Class 2 Misdemeanors

Chart 18 shows that Class 2 misdemeanor filings have remained steady while the number of guilty pleas have increased over the past fiscal year.

Chart 19 shows that Class 2 misdemeanor dismissals have increased slightly over FY2000. Of the 17,354 dismissals reported for FY2001, 12,598 or 72.6% were for “financial responsibility” arrests. Financial responsibility arrests are made when a driver is stopped by a law enforcement officer for a traffic violation and the driver cannot produce proof of financial responsibility (usually an auto insurance card). If the defendant can later produce such proof for a clerk-magistrate, the charge is dismissed.

Some other Class 2 misdemeanor dismissals occur when a traffic case is removed from active court files because a defendant’s driver’s license has been suspended by the Office of Driver Improvement for failure to appear or pay a fine after a period of six months. In order to have a license reinstated, the defendant must have the court issue an order. Then the defendant must pay a substantial cash penalty to the Department of Commerce and Regulation. The defendant also faces the possibility of an additional criminal charge for failing to appear in court on the original violation.

Table 17 (page 46) lists Class 2 misdemeanor and petty offense traffic violations for the fiscal year. The offenses in the detailed list include those with 50 arrests or more. Those with an SDCL Code prefix of 99 are municipal ordinance violations.

Class 2 Caseload Filings and Guilty Pleas**

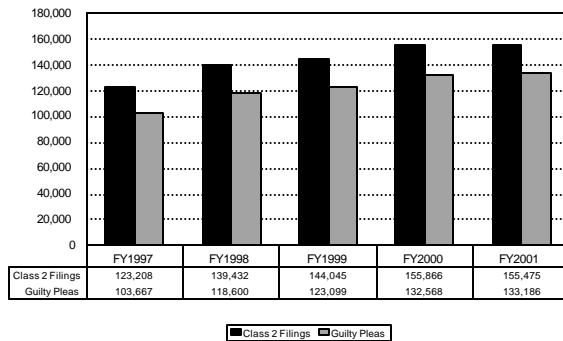
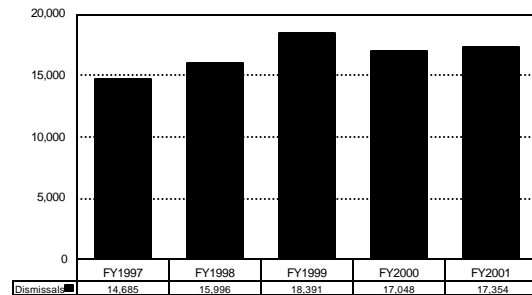


Chart 19. Comparison - Class 2 Dismissals
