Criminal Caseload

The charts below compare criminal case filings for the past five fiscal years.

A summary of traffic offenses and fines is presented in Table 19 on page 49. Total misdemeanor filings have decreased slightly over last fiscal year.

Felony Cases

Felony filings have remained steady this past fiscal year (Chart 12) over FY2008. Felony jury trials have increased slightly while guilty pleas have decreased slightly. Class I misdemeanor jury trials remained relatively consistent over the past fiscal year (Chart 13).

Chart 12. Felony Caseload Comparisons

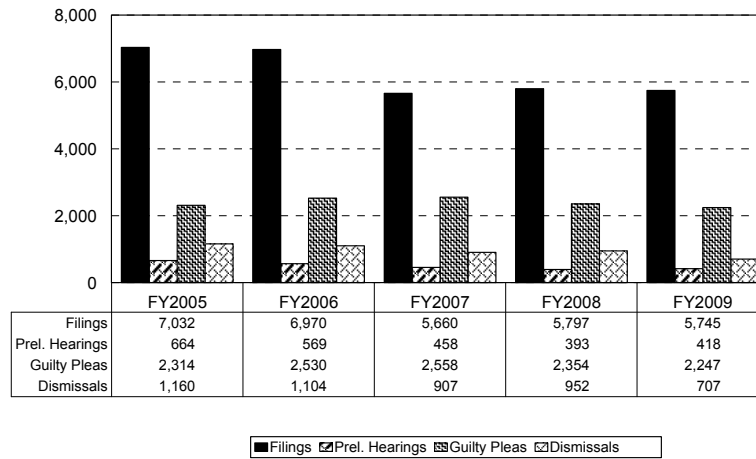


Chart 13. Five-Year Jury Trial Comparison

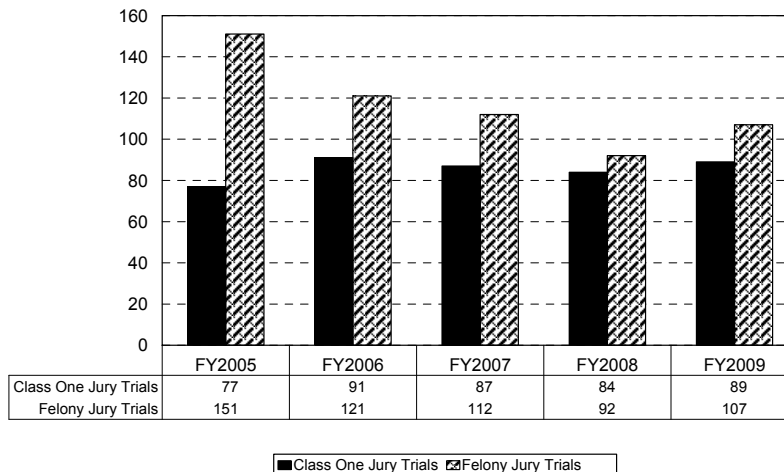
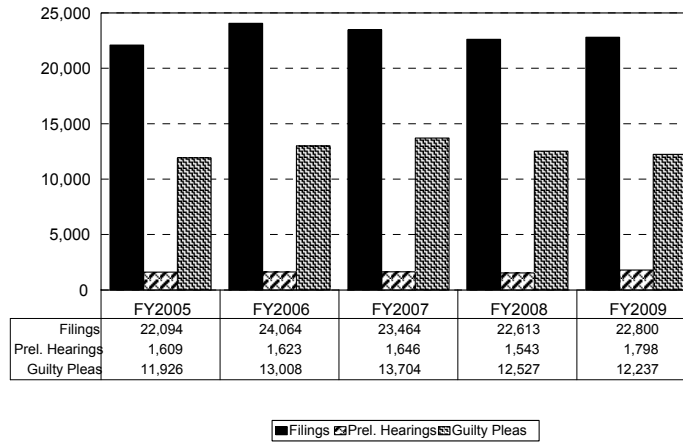


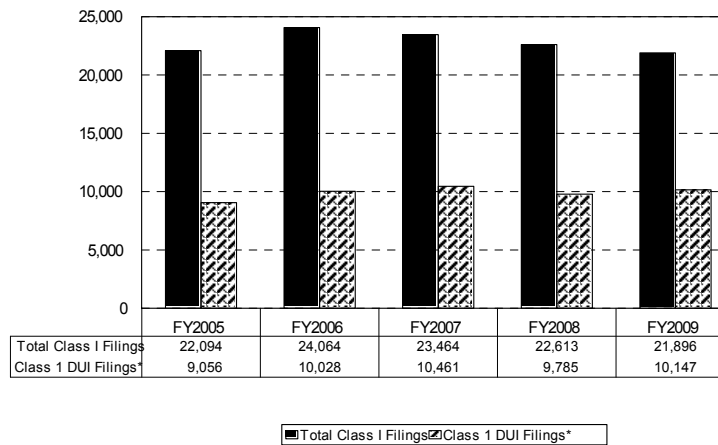
Chart 14. Class I Misdemeanor Caseload Comparison



Total Class 1 misdemeanor filings have remained relatively steady over the past fiscal year (Chart 14). Chart 15 compares Total Class 1 misdemeanor filings with Class 1 misdemeanor DUI filings (first and second offenses.)

In FY1996, DUI offenses accounted for 44.9% of total Class 1 misdemeanor filings. This past fiscal year Class 1 DUI violations represent approximately 39.7% of the total Class 1 violations which decreased again this past fiscal year.

* Class One Misdemeanor DUI Filings include only DUI first and second offense filings. Third, fourth and fifth offenses are charged as felonies. In FY2009, there was an additional 1,095 felony DUI filings for a total of 10,147 DUI filings statewide.

DUI Cases

A significant percentage of Class 1 misdemeanors as well as felony cases are violations of ch. 32-23 and are referred to as DUI (driving under the influence) cases. The most common dispositions of DUI's for the past five

fiscal years are illustrated in Table 17. First and second DUI violations (DUI One and DUI Two) are Class 1 misdemeanors. Third and subsequent offenses (DUI Three, DUI Four and DUI Five) are felonies. Selected segments of this data are compared in Charts 16 and 17 on the following page.

Many of the DUI dismissals shown in Table 17 (page 45) result from a defendant's guilty plea to a lesser charge, usually reckless driving, which is also a Class 1 misdemeanor. Such plea bargains occur when a prosecutor believes the state's evidence is inadequate for a DUI conviction and the prosecutor is willing to save the state the expense of a more time-consuming prosecution in return for the defen-

dant's guilty plea to a lesser charge. Conviction for more than one reckless driving violation within a one-year period will result in suspension of the violator's driving license for a minimum of 30 days.

Table 18 (page 47) presents DUI filings and dispositions for the current fiscal year by county and circuit.

Chart 16. DUI Filings

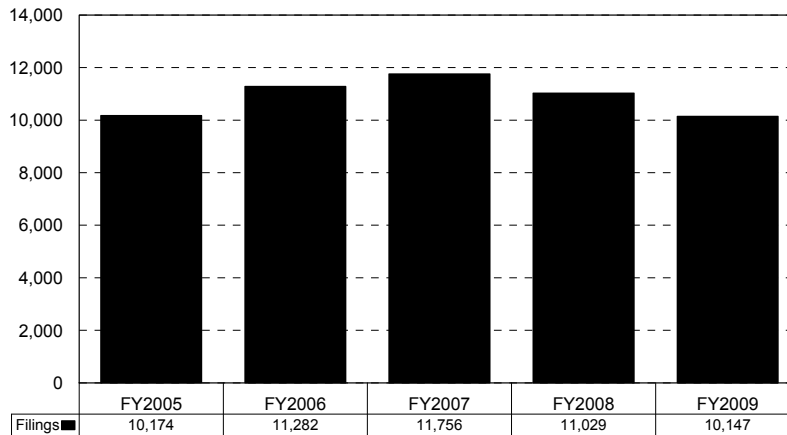


Chart 17. DUI Dispositions

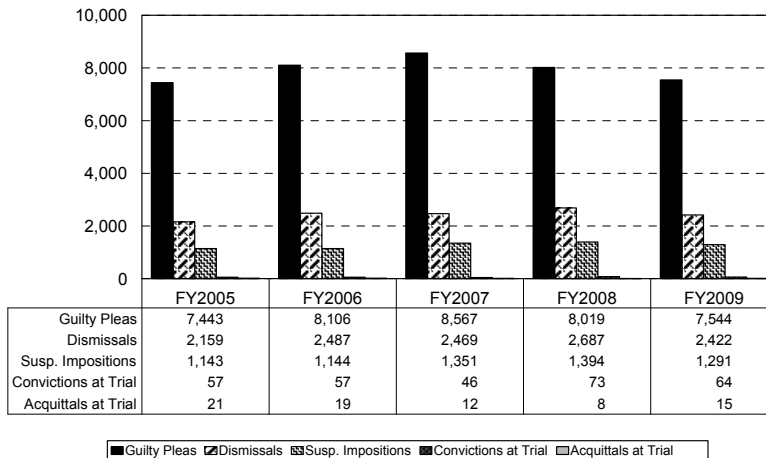

Class 2 Misdemeanors

Chart 18 shows that Class 2 misdemeanor filings and guilty pleas have decreased this past fiscal year.

Chart 19 shows that Class 2 misdemeanor dismissals have remained relatively steady since FY2005. Of the 15,301 Class 2 dismissals reported for FY2009, 12,426 or 81.2% were for “financial responsibility” arrests. Financial responsibility arrests (SDCL 32-35-113) are made when a driver is stopped by a law enforcement officer for a traffic violation and the driver cannot produce proof of financial responsibility (usually an auto insurance card). If the defendant can later produce such proof for a clerk-magistrate, the charge is dismissed.

Some other Class 2 misdemeanor dismissals occur when a traffic case is removed from active court files because a defendant’s driver’s license has been suspended by the Office of Driver Improvement for failure to appear or pay a fine after a period of six months. In order to have a license reinstated, the defendant must have the court issue an order. Then the defendant must pay a substantial cash penalty to the Department of Commerce and Regulation. The defendant also faces the possibility of an additional criminal charge for failing to appear in court on the original violation.

Table 19 (page 49) lists Class 2 misdemeanor, municipal ordinances and petty offense traffic violations for the fiscal year. The offenses in the detailed list include those with 50 arrests or more. Those with an SDCL Code prefix of 99 are municipal ordinance violations.

Class 2 Caseload Filings and Guilty Pleas**

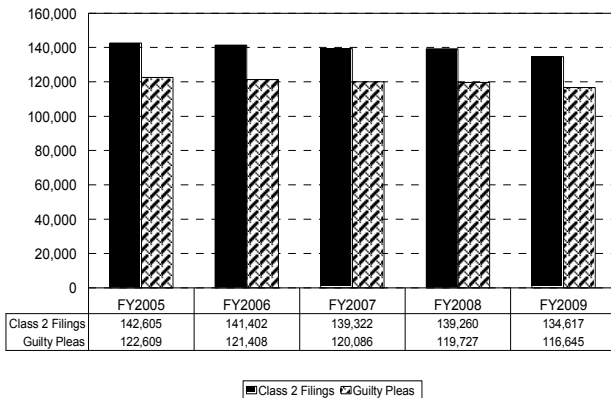
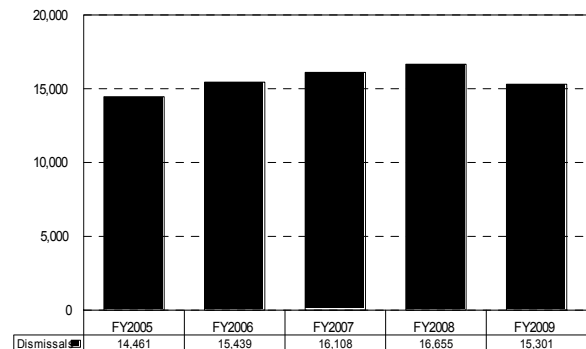


Chart 19. Comparison - Class 2 Dismissals
