## STATEMENT OF THE ISSUES

1. DID THE CIRCUIT COURT ERR IN GRANTING SUMMARY JUDGMENT TO DEFENDANT ON PLAINTIFF'S COMPLAINT?

Trial Court Decision: The Honorable John J. Delaney granted summary judgment for Defendant on Plaintiff's Complaint, thereby ruling that a primary credit cardholder who adds a second cardholder (authorized user) to the account is relieved as a matter of law from responsibility for charges when the second cardholder (authorized user) uses a renewal credit card to charge to the account.

2. DID THE CIRCUIT COURT ERR IN DENYING SUMMARY JUDGMENT TO PLAINTIFF ON DEFENDANT'S COUNTERCLAIM FOR INTENTIONAL INFLICTION OF EMOTIONAL DISTRESS?

Trial Court Decision: The Honorable John J. Delaney, Sr., denied summary judgment to Plaintiff on Defendant's Counterclaim for intentional infliction of emotional distress, in light of his finding that Plaintiff was not entitled, as a matter of law, to collect from Defendant for changes by the secondary cardholder (authorized user) to Defendant's credit card account using the renewal credit card.

JUDGMENT TO PLAINTIFF ON DEFENDANT'S COUNTERCLAIM FOR BARRATRY?

Trial Court Decision: The Honorable John J. Delaney, Sr., denied summary judgment to Plaintiff on Defendant's Counterclaim for barratry, in light of his finding that Plaintiff was not entitled, as a matter of law, to collect from Defendant for charges by the secondary cardholder (authorized user) to Defendant's credit card account using the renewal credit card.
