STATEMENT OF THE ISSUE-

Does a Trial Court have jurisdiction to enforce its order of restitution after a defendant has served his prison sentence?

The Trial Court held that it did not.

QUESTIONS PRESENTED

I. WHETHER THE CIRCUIT COURT MAY RETROACTIVELY MODIFY A PLAN OF RESTITUTION SET BY THE BOARD OF PARDONS AND PAROLES AND SATISFIED BY HOLSING.

The circuit court held that the statutory scheme as it existed at the time of sentencing deprived the court of supervisory jurisdiction. Thus, the amount and plan of restitution was properly set by the Board of Pardons and Paroles, with due notice to the victims, and cannot now be modified.
