Pursuant to a hearing held on February 18, 1994, at Pierre, South Dakota, relating to the amendment of SDCL 16-19-30, the Court having considered the proposed amendment, the correspondence and oral presentations relating thereto, if any, and being fully advised in the premises, now, therefore, it is

ORDERED that SDCL 16-19-30 be and it is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

16-19-30. Complaints and testimony privileged--Board and staff immune from suit. Complaints submitted to the board or testimony with respect thereto shall be absolutely privileged and no civil action predicated thereon may be instituted. Members of the board, the board's counsel, board staff and any personnel or legal counsel appointed pursuant to § 16-19-29(2) shall be immune from suit for any conduct in the course of their official duties.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this rule shall become effective July 1, 1994.
