Court-Appointed Attorney Costs

SDCL 23A-40-7 provides that the governing board of any county or municipality is responsible for providing legal counsel to anyone within their jurisdiction who is charged with a Class 1 misdemeanor or felony. If the county maintains a public defender's office, judges or magistrates will assign this office to represent indigent defendants. In counties where there is no public defender system, an attorney will be appointed.

The cost of court-appointed representation is initially borne by the county in which the charge is levied. The judge may assess attorney costs against the defendant as a part of a sentence. There is also a provision for creation of a lien against a defendant's real or personal property (SDCL 23A-40-11 and -12).

Whether represented by court-appointed counsel or by a public defender's office, and regardless of whether or not the defendant is convicted, the defendant is expected to repay the cost of the court-appointed attorney.

In addition to the costs repaid directly by the defendant, a \$6.00 fee is collected for each criminal conviction including traffic violations. This is paid into a court-appointed attorney fund established by state law. This year the fund provided an allocation to each county of approximately 9.0% of the court-appointed attorney costs incurred. This figure is shown in the second column of Table B-4 on page 29.

Table B-4 also shows county expenditures and defendant repayment as reported to the State Treasurer by the counties.

Chart B-2 on page 28 graphically compares court-appointed attorney costs and repayment by circuit for the past fiscal year. The Minnehaha (Second Circuit) and Pennington County (Seventh Circuit) Public Defender's Offices have full-time legal staffs funded by the counties to provide for the defense of economically disadvantaged persons accused of crimes. Lawrence and Butte Counties (Fourth Circuit) also share the expense of a full-time public defender's office.

The data contained in Table B-4 on page 29 shows the raw approximate average cost to each county for each court-appointed attorney case. This average does not include costs recovered by the counties either from direct payments by defendants, state reimbursements, or county lien collection efforts. When cost recovery is included in the calculation, the average payment per appointment is substantially lower. These costs were computed by dividing the total payment for the fiscal year by the total number of court-appointed attorney cases. Table B-4 also shows the percentage of total Class 1 misdemeanor and felony filings which resulted in court appointment of an attorney.

Chart B-2 on page 28 shows that the difference between the cost of court-appointed attorneys and the amount the UJS collects has increased over the past five years. The cost for court

-appointed attorneys is difficult to predict from year to year because it depends on the number of arrests by

law enforcement agencies and the number of criminal prosecutions filed by the state's attorney in each county.

Chart B-2. Court-Appointed Attorney Costs Compared to Repayment by Circuit - FY2011

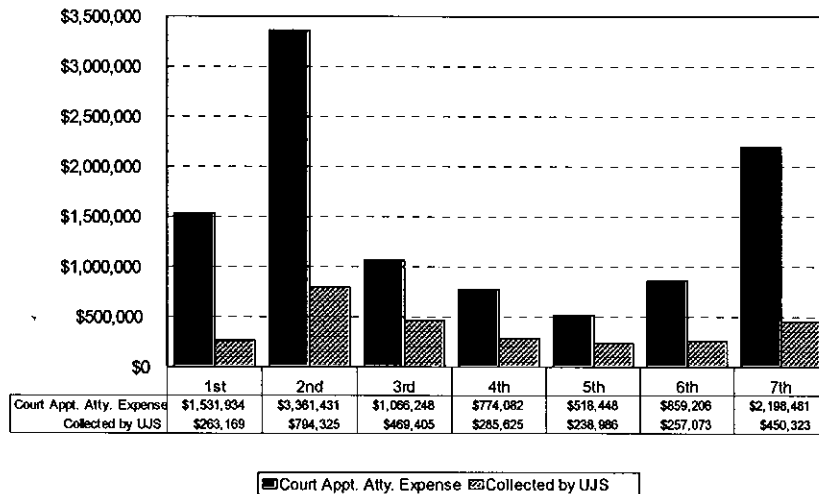
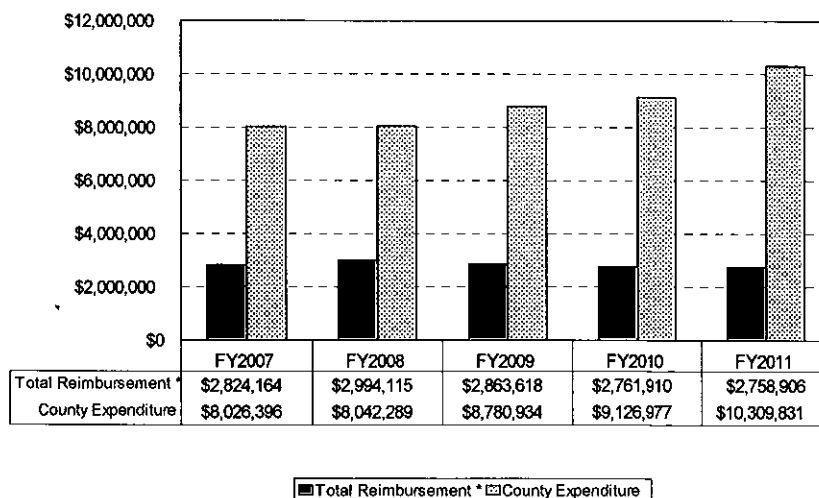


Chart B-3. Court-Appointed Attorney Cost Payback by Fiscal Year

Criminal Caseload

The charts below compare criminal filing and disposition data for the past five fiscal years.

A summary of traffic offenses and fines is presented in Table B-20 on page 45. Total overall misdemeanor filings and jury trials decreased over last fiscal year.

Felony Cases

Felony filings and guilty pleas have increased significantly over the past fiscal year (Charts B-11 and B-12) while felony preliminary hearings and jury trials have decreased slightly.

Chart B-10. Criminal Filings Comparison

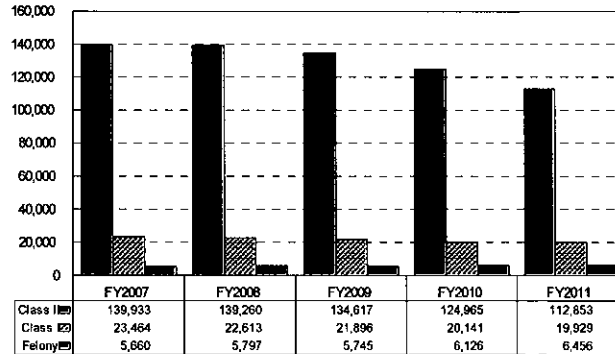


Chart B-11. Felony Caseload Comparisons

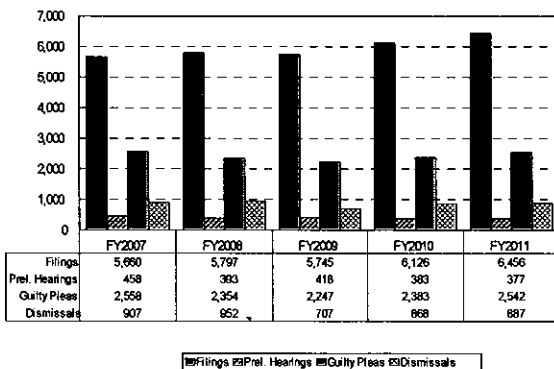


Chart B-12. Five-Year Jury Trial Comparison

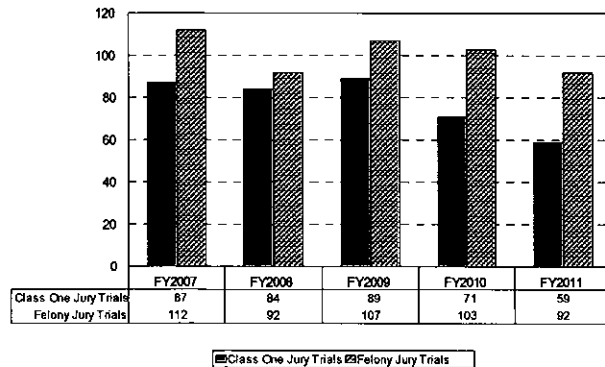
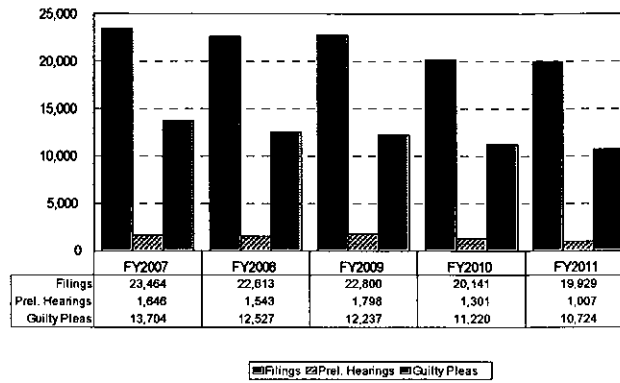


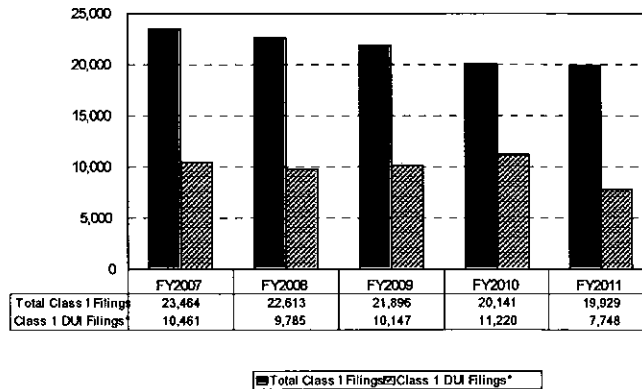
Chart B-13. Class I Misdemeanor Caseload Comparison



Charts B-13 and B-14 compare Total Class 1 misdemeanor filings with Class 1 misdemeanor DUI filings (first and second offenses.)

In FY2007 (as a five-year comparison), DUI offenses accounted for 44.6% (10,461 of 23,464) of total Class 1 misdemeanor filings. In FY2011, that number decreased significantly to 38.9% (7,748 of 19,929) of the total Class 1 misdemeanor filings.

Class 2 Misdemeanors

Chart B-15 shows that Class 2 misdemeanor filings and guilty pleas continue to decrease.

Chart B-16 shows that Class 2 misdemeanor dismissals have decreased slightly since FY2007. Of the 13,548 Class 2 dismissals reported for FY2011, 10,473 or 77.3% were for "financial responsibility" arrests. Financial responsibility arrests (SDCL 32-35-113) are made when a driver is stopped by a law enforcement officer for a traffic violation and the driver cannot produce acceptable proof of financial responsibility (usually an auto insurance card). If the defendant can later produce such proof for a clerk-magistrate, the charge is dismissed. See Table B-23 for further information.

Some other Class 2 misdemeanor dismissals occur when a traffic case is removed from active court files because a defendant's driver's license has been suspended by the Office of Driver Licensing for failure to appear or pay a fine after a period of six months. In order to have a license reinstated, the defendant must have the court issue an order. Then the defendant must pay a reinstatement fee to the Department of Public Safety. The defendant also faces the possibility of an additional criminal charge for failing to appear in court on the original violation.

Table B-20 on Page 45 lists Class 2 misdemeanor, municipal ordinances and petty offense traffic violations for the fiscal year. The offenses in the detailed list include those with 50 arrests or more. Those with an SDCL Code prefix of 99 are municipal ordinance violations.

Class 2 Casefile Filings and Guilty Pleas

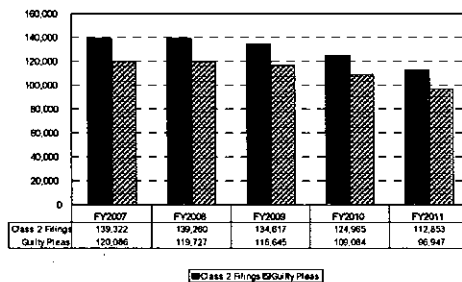
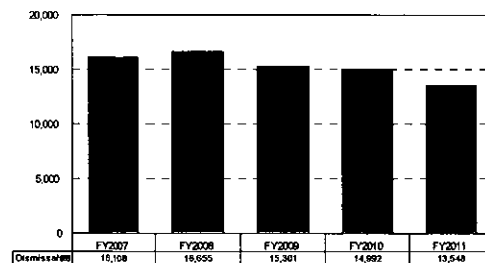


Chart B-16. Comparison - Class 2 Dismissals



DUI Cases

A significant percentage of Class 1 misdemeanors as well as felony cases are violations of ch. 32-23 and are referred to as DUI (driving under the influence) cases. The most common dispositions of DUI's for the past five fiscal years are illustrated in Table B-17 below. First an

and second DUI violations (DUI One and DUI Two) are Class 1 misdemeanors. Third and subsequent offenses (DUI Three, DUI Four and DUI Five) are felonies. Selected segments of this data are compared in Chart B-18 on the following page.

Many of the DUI dismissals shown on the previous page on Table B-17 result from a defendant's guilty plea to a lesser charge, usually reckless driving, which is also a Class 1 misdemeanor. Such plea bargains occur when a prosecutor believes the state's evidence is inadequate for a DUI conviction and the prosecutor is willing to save the state the expense of a more time-

consuming prosecution in return for the defendant's guilty plea to a lesser charge. Conviction for more than one reckless driving violation within a one-year period will result in suspension of the violator's driving license for a minimum of 30 days. A DUI case-load comparison is included in Chart B-18 below.

Chart B-18. DUI Filings

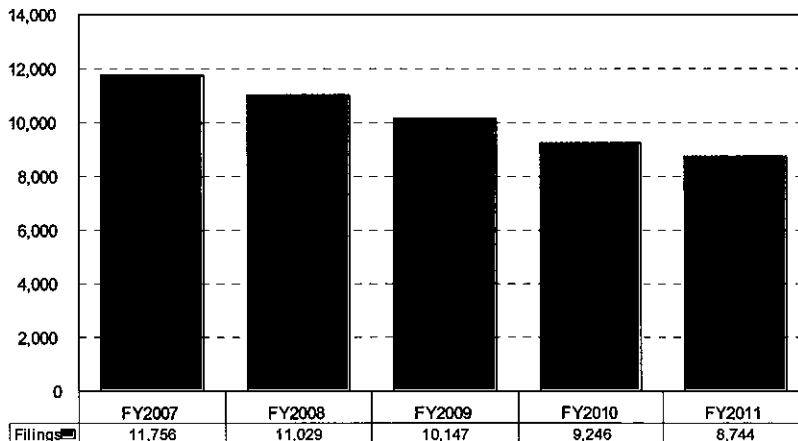

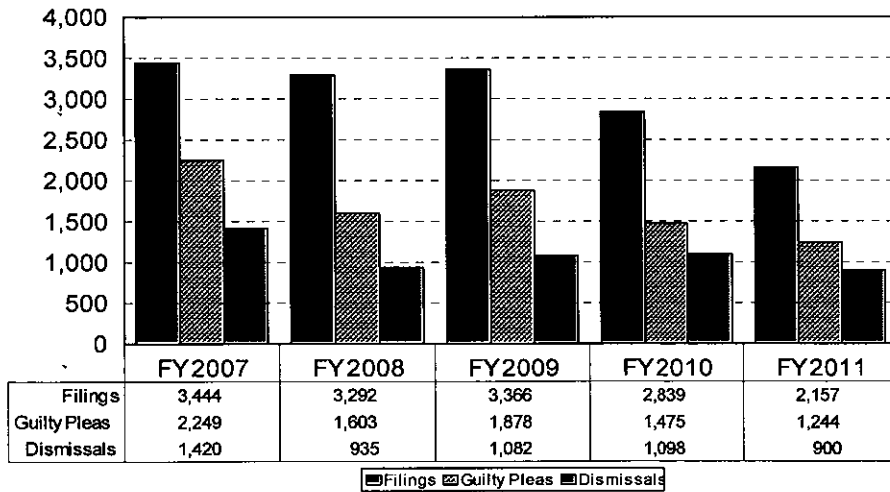

Chart B-22. Insufficient Funds Check Comparison

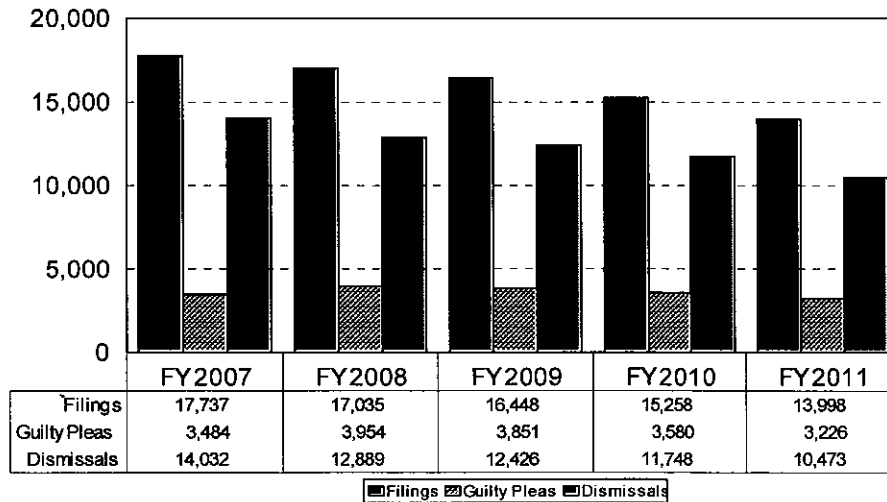

Chart B-24. Financial Responsibility Violations Comparison

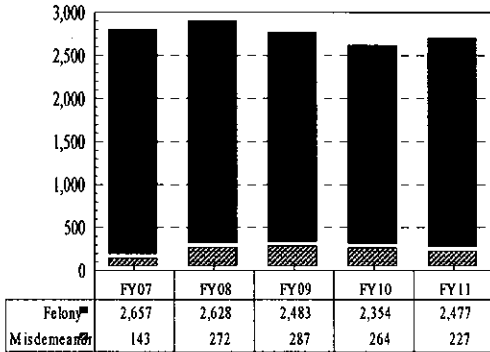

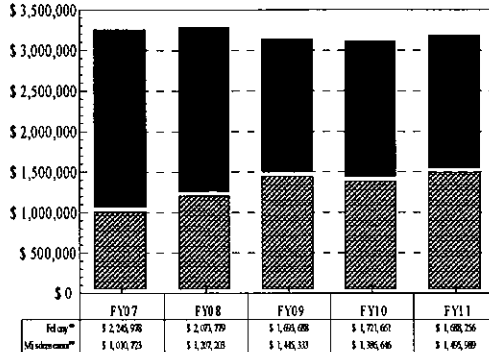
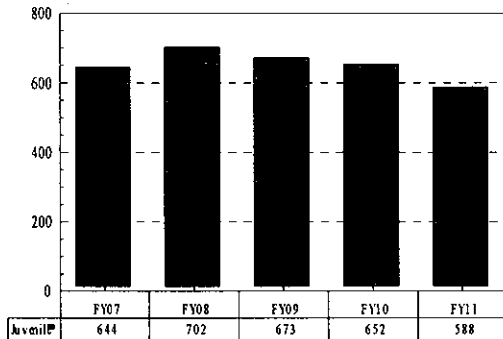


Chart B-27. Court Services Workload Juvenile Services
